Did you know that your district can offer an "official" test administration of the ACT at schools during regular school hours on a weekday? Since 2007, students in 47 states have earned college-reportable scores taking the ACT in their own classrooms through ACT State and District Testing.

Participating in ACT District Testing provides your students with the opportunity to assess their academic skills and level of college readiness in a familiar environment. Having all students participate raises every student's college readiness, awareness and exposure, rather than only students who already have plans to attend college. For some students, the experience may help them realize they have the skills to perform college-level coursework.
